WHAT: The Seminole County Fire Department's (SCFD) new Airboat 42 stationed in Geneva at Station 42 has recently gone into service. To name the new and SCFD's first airboat, the Fire Department asked for Geneva Elementary School's help.

Its official name will be unveiled and be proudly displayed on Airboat 42 (name will be on the boat at the ceremony). The boat is named by one of the classes. Every Geneva Elementary class submitted name suggestions and SCFD picked a winning class (5th grade) and runner-up class (1st grade). The winning classes will enjoy ice cream from Kelly's Homemade Ice Cream and treats from Mission BBQ.
