



Message from the Seminole County Board of County Commissioner

Welcome to the Seminole County website for the 2010 U.S. Census. The U.S. Constitution requires a census of the population to occur every 10 years. The 2010 Census will determine allocation of billions of dollars in federal funds each year for such activities and programs as neighborhood improvements, public health, education, and transportation important to the quality of life of residents of Seminole County. Census data also determines representation in the U.S. House of Representatives and for redistricting state and local legislative districts.

April 1, 2010 is National Census Day, the point of reference for returning completed census forms to the U.S. Census Bureau. In March 2010, the Census Bureau will begin mailing or delivering census forms to every residence in the United States and Puerto Rico. Returning your form can bring additional funding to Seminole County beneficial to our community's quality of life.

In partnership with the U.S. Census Bureau, the Seminole County 2010 Census Complete Count Committee is busy spreading the word about the importance of the 2010 Census – neighbor to neighbor. The Committee will focus on raising the awareness and importance of the 2010 Census and encourage residents in Seminole County to return their census questionnaire.
