

SECTION 4. BOARDS, COMMISSIONS, COUNCILS AND COMMITTEES

4.10 DISABILITY ADVISORY COUNCIL

A. PURPOSE. The Seminole County Disability Advisory Council (“DAC”) is a recommending body to the BCC on issues and policies affecting disabled persons within Seminole County and raise awareness of the disabled which is consistent with the objectives, goals and policies of the Seminole County Comprehensive Plan.

B. DUTIES/RESPONSIBILITIES. The DAC shall assist in identifying issues that are of a special concern to the disabled community of Seminole County and will prepare recommendations for presentation to the BCC. All meetings shall be open public meetings and be subject to all laws relating to conflicts of interest and the Code of Ethics for Public Officers and Employees. DAC shall elect its own officers and adopt its rules of procedure either informally or formally.

C. FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE. Required.

D. LOYALTY OATH. Not Required.

E. MEMBERSHIP STRUCTURE.

(1) Requirements. Ten (10) Members.

(2) Appointment Process. Each Commissioner shall appoint two (2) DAC members. Each Commissioner may fill vacancies that occur on the DAC relating to appointees made by said Commissioner or his or her predecessor Commissioner.

(3) Term of Office. DAC members shall serve a two (2) year term. No DAC member shall serve more than two (2) consecutive terms.

(4) The DAC shall exist through December 31, 2010, unless continued or discontinued prior to that time by the Board of County Commissioners.
