This assistance will offer relief to homeless families that are literally homeless. Providing safe, decent housing will also help safeguard against the spread of COVID-19 among the homeless, by placing homeless families in permanent, non-shelter housing, especially if they were literally homeless at the time of the Covid-19 outbreak. The funds will be used to provide rental assistance, housing search and placement case management. The following documents will be used to verify tenants are seeking assistance as a result of COVID-19, including but not limited to: termination of employment, notice of eviction, documentation of shelter stay, and case management notes/ referrals for services during the COVID-19 outbreak.</p> <p>The remainder of funds (\$202,952) will be used for an internally run Rapid- Rehousing Program aimed at Re-housing homeless individuals, particularly those who have been in shelters during the Covid-19 outbreak. The aim is to prevent the spread of COVID-19 in shelter environments by rehousing individuals in permanent, non- shelter housing, especially if they were literally homeless or in shelter during the COVID-19 outbreak. The funds would provide rent assistance, as well as housing stability case management.
