Thanks to the cooperative efforts of Seminole County Public Works and its dedicated SERV (Seminole Education, Restoration and Volunteer) Program volunteers, the Kids House Children's Advocacy Center, a safe and caring place where child victims of abuse can find compassionate care and healing, recently converted its 1.5 acre stormwater retention pond into a Wildlife Garden. The area now features native aquatic plant species that improves water quality and aesthetics, while providing shelter for migratory and aquatic birds, butterflies and turtles. Most importantly, Kids House therapists will use this area to treat child clients in a nature-based therapeutic setting.
