- 3. Veteran of the Month, February 2018, Ed Sends On February 13, 2018, Major Octavius R. Clark, United States Navy and United States Air Force (Retired) was recognized by the Seminole County Board of County Commission (BCC) as February 2018 Veteran of the Month. A Resolution, signed by the Chairman of the Board was presented to Major Clark. He served three years in the United States Navy after graduating from Seminole High School and retired from the US Air Force Reserve in December 2017; he served two combat tours in Irag and one combat tour in Afghanistan, he has been awarded numerous awards and decorations. A selfdescribed Native Son of Seminole County, Major Clark grew up on his Grandparents farm in Bookertown, Seminole County, and graduated from Seminole High School; after spending his three years in the Navy, he went to college on a track scholarship and became a world class runner. He ran professionally for almost six years and won a Gold Medal in the 1991 Pan American Games held in Cuba where Fedele Castro presented him with his Gold Medal; after retiring from professional sports, Major Clark returned to Seminole County and is currently Dean of Students at Winter Springs High School and is the Coach for both the Cross Country and Track Teams, winning a State championship in 1999. Absentee Voting Procedures Update, Military.com Week of January 22, 2018, The Federal Voting Assistance Program (FVAP) has announced the release of the 2018-2019 Voting Assistance Guide with updated content for the 2018 General Election cycle. FVAP publishes the Guide for use by voters, military and State Department Voting Assistance Officers (VAOs), overseas citizen organizations and election officials. It includes the procedures that military and overseas voters must follow to successfully register to vote Read more.
- 5. Khe Sanh Veterans Mark 50th Anniversary of Vietnam Battle Military.com via Fox News, 21 Jan 2018, Today marks the 50th anniversary of the start of one of the most significant battles of the Vietnam War -- the Battle of Khe Sanh. Across the U.S., groups of Vietnam veterans are gathering to commemorate the 77-day battle, in which some 6,000 U.S. Marines defended a small combat base from tens of thousands of North Vietnamese fighters. VA Launches New Tool To Make Upgrading Your Discharge Easier Military.com Week of January 29, 2018, If you received a less than perfect discharge from the military and are confused about how to get it changed, the VA and DOD have a new program that may help you. The VA's VETS.GOV has launched a new online tool in

partnership with the DOD to make filing for a discharge upgrade a lot easier. Read more.

- 7. Commissary Benefits at Risk Due to Falling Sales Military.com Week of February 12, 2018, Sales at on-base grocery stores have fallen six percent in the past year, 21.3 percent since 2012, putting the shopping benefit at greater risk, say commissary executives. The worry is that falling sales leave commissaries open to criticism that they're losing relevancy as a military perk, or becoming too costly for taxpayers to support, given the fierce competition for customers from commercial grocers. Low Recruit Discipline Prompts Army to Redesign Basic Training Military.com Week of February 12, 2018, The U.S. Army will soon launch a redesign of Basic Combat Training intended to build more discipline after many commanders complained that new soldiers often show up to their first units with a sloppy appearance and undisciplined attitudes. - Trump's 2019 Budget Includes 2.6% Raise, Modest Force Size Boost Military.com 12 Feb 2018, The Defense Department's budget request for 2019 released Monday called for a 2.6 percent military pay raise, a modest increase in the end strengths of the services, and major rebuilding programs aimed at retaining the U.S. edge over China and Russia. How President's Food Stamp Cuts Would Impact Military Families Military.com 14 Feb 2018, A federal funding proposal issued by the White House this week would cut the amount of food aid given to most recipients, including many military families, and replace it with a subscription-style box of delivered foods. Instead, about half of the benefits received by more than 80 percent of all users would be replaced by a regular supply of government-sourced nonperishable foods, which officials likened to a "Blue Apron-type program." Everything You Need to Know About Trump's 2019 Budget Request Military.com 12 Feb 2018, President Donald Trump on Monday released his budget request for fiscal 2019, marking the first step in a months-long process in which lawmakers from both chambers of Congress debate and ultimately decide on its funding levels and policy provisions. Trump's defense budget request for the fiscal year beginning Oct. 1 totals \$716 billion, including \$686 billion for the Defense Department alone. Read more.
- 12. **US Military Adds More Than 4,000 Names to Gun Ban List** Military.com via New York Daily News 13 Feb 2018, A Texas church massacre that killed 26 people last year prompted the U.S. military to add the names of more than 4,000 people to the list of dishonorably discharged people banned from owning guns, according to a report. VA resumes online applications for new ID cards Stars and Stripes, January 29, 2018 Veterans can again submit online applications for new identification cards through the Department of Veterans Affairs website after the system was taken down in December following rollout problems. The purpose of the identification cards is to help veterans prove their military history without having to carry around their DD-214 certificates, which contain sensitive information. The new IDs do not replace VA medical cards or defense retiree cards, nor do they qualify as official government-issued identification. Read more.

Not Enough Veterans Are Opting Into The VA's Test Plan To Fix Appeals Task & Purpose, February 1, 2018, Last year, President Donald Trump signed the Appeals Modernization Act of 2017 into law a policy meant to jump-start appeals reform within the Department of Veterans Affairs, with an eye toward ending the backlog of appeals for veterans benefit claims, which is sitting at around 470,000. VA Will Not Study Use of Medical Marijuana Military.com Week of January 22, 2018, The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) says it will not conduct research into the effects of medical cannabis on post-traumatic stress disorder and chronic pain, some of the very ailments veteran patients rely on the drug to treat. VA to Share Data with Dept. of Health Military.com Week of January 29, 2018, The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) and the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) have announced a partnership to share data, data analytics tools and best practices for identifying and preventing fraud, waste and abuse. - 17. **Telehealth Revolutionizing Veterans Health Care** Military.com Week of January 29, 2018, The Department of Veterans Affairs is using new technology to deliver health care to veterans. VA's TeleHealth service utilizes health informatics, disease management and telehealth technologies to care for and provide case management. VA Video Connect, February 5, 2018, News Release, Greetings Veterans, The Orlando VAMC has a new Telehealth service called VA Video Connect which enables Veterans to see VA Healthcare Providers in a *virtual medical room*, using encrypted video to ensure the session is secure and private. It allows Veterans to see and speak with their healthcare team from anywhere. If you have a Smart Phone, iPad, iPhone or mobile device with internet connection and video capability, it may be possible to connect with your health care team through a VA Video Connect web link. If interested in using this technology, let your provider know and he/she will contact the Orlando VAMC Telehealth Service for follow up. Read more.
