

SEMINOLE COUNTY HURRICANE IRMA RESPONSE BY THE NUMBERS



STATISTICS OF STORM

- 73 mph sustained winds
- 18+ inches of rainfall in various parts of the community



STATISTICS OF SHELTER

- Nine shelters opened
- Three special needs shelters opened
- Six general population shelters opened
- Two pet-friendly shelters opened
- 1,633 People in shelters
- 216 Pets in shelters



DISTRIBUTION STATISTICS

- 335,626 Sandbags distributed before Irma
- 11 Sandbag distribution locations (City and County operated)
- Additional 250,000 sandbags ordered during storm
- 27,600 Bottles of water distributed
- 2,500 Meals ready to eat distributed
- Over 3,500 tarps distributed



DEBRIS AND COLLECTION STATISTICS

- 1,000,000 Estimated cubic yards of debris countywide
- 4 Free Residential drop-off points
- 5,746 Drop-offs at residential sites (9/13/17-10/4/17)
- 284 Loads of debris collected in the first five days of collection



POWER LOST/ RESTORED STATISTICS

- 156,103 Duke Customers lost power
- 4,400 FPL Customers lost power
- 240 Traffic signals out



FIRE DEPARTMENT RESPONSE STATISTICS

- \$1,554,592 Value of property saved
- 6,725 Communications Center calls in seven days
- 3,378 Incidents created
- 51 Carbon Monoxide calls
- 11 Storm-related fires
- 11 Full-term pregnant patients transported



PUBLIC WORKS STATISTICS

- Three days: South Lane washed out and completely repaired
- All County roads passable three and half days after storm
- Four days: Curryville Road washed out and completely repaired
- Five Days: Airport Blvd washed out and completely repaired
- 259 Traffic signs repaired
- 77 Traffic signals damaged, repaired/ temporarily repaid within 8 days



COMMUNITY/STAFF INVOLVEMENT STATISTICS

- 50,000 Staff hours logged during height of storm
- 1,966 Volunteer hours completed
- 8 FEMA Disaster Survivor Assistance employees in Seminole County
- 352 Unmet needs, 335 fulfilled



RESIDENT COMMUNICATION STATISTICS

- 14,271 Citizens Information Line calls in ten days
- 166,681 Page visits to PrepareSeminole.org during storm
- 60,102 Seminole County Nextdoor subscribers
- 12,457 Facebook page likes
- 4,395 New Facebook likes in September
- 497,827 Facebook users reached (8/22-9/18)
- 272,476 Facebook post engagements (8/22-9/18)
- 8,596 Total Twitter followers
- 1,315 New Twitter followers (8/22-9/18)
- 228 Tweets posted (8/22-9/18)
- 857,000 Twitter impressions
- 3,202 Text group subscriptions



COUNTY FACILITIES INSPECTED

- One day for all major structures to be inspected
- Two days for all secondary structures to be inspected



BUILDINGS INSPECTED

- 74,000 Windshield inspections conducted



MOSQUITO MITIGATION

- 58 Miles fogged in two days
- 163 Larvicide treatments over 59 acres in two days
- 49,000 Acres Covered in rural, eastern parts Seminole County during Aerial Treatment
