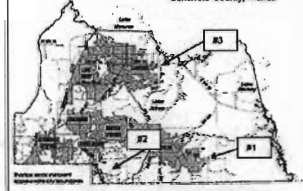

The County received approximately \$483,388 in SHIP funds from the State this year (State Fiscal Year 7/1/09 to 6/30/10).

Effective February 1, 2010 the County will accept applications for Rental Security and Utility Deposits with initial priority being given to applicants in the Seminole County Community Assistance Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-housing Program (HPRP). A minimum amount of \$200,000 from previous year's SHIP allocations will be provided to qualified very low and low income households in need of becoming homeless as a result of the inability to pay security and/or utility deposits when seeking residence in rental housing. Applications will be accepted from applicants in the Seminole County Community Assistance HPRP between February 1 and February 28, 2010. Effective March 1, 2010 the program will open to the general public. Applications will be available at Seminole County Community Assistance, 534 West Lake Mary Boulevard, Sanford, FL 32773 or at http://www.seminolecountyfl.gov/commsa/commsast/.

In addition, effective February 15, 2010 the County will accept applications for Homeowner Rehabilitation. A minimum amount of \$300,000 from previous year's SHIP allocations will be provided to qualified very low and low income homeowner's in need of assistance for repairs and/or alterations to improve their health, safety, and well being or contribute to structural integrity and preservation of their owner occupied home. Applications will be available at Seminole County Community Assistance, 534 West Lake Mary Boulevard, Sanford, Florida 32773 or at http://www.seminolecountyfl.gov/commsa/commsast/.
