- Make sure that you answer "yes" to the are you a volunteer question when completing the enrollment sections. This will allow you to see the enrollment fields that are relevant for volunteers.
- When finished click Submit Enrollment. You will be contacted by your County 4-H Staff with further instructions for completing any required background screenings and required volunteer trainings.

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
