PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

- **Mother Goose on the Loose (20 minute program for children birth to 18 months with adult)** – Join us for the nationally recognized Mother Goose on the Loose early literacy program. Enjoy interacting with your wee one as you hear stories, learn nursery rhymes and finger-plays, sing, and move with scarves, and shake bells.
- **Learn & Play (2 hour program for ages 0-4 with an adult)** - Drop-in anytime between 9:30-11:30 AM to meet other caregivers, enjoy playtime with your baby, and see examples of early literacy activities.
- **Art Starts (45 minute program for ages 0-4 with adult)** – For the littlest artists! Featuring free play with materials after a short early literacy skills based storytime. *No registration required.*
- **Toddler Time (20 minute program for children 18 months to age 3 with adult)** – Stories, songs, puppets and finger-plays just for toddlers, while introducing early literacy concepts for parents and caregivers.
- **Early Literacy Play Date (1 hour program for children 3-5 years old with adult)** – Drop in for a variety of fun activities and stations that promote early literacy development, motor skills practice, and Kindergarten readiness.
- **Preschool Storytime (20 minute program for children 3-5 years old with adult)** – Join in the fun with stories, songs, puppets and more that encourage development of early literacy skills.
- **Library Explorers (45 minute program for ages 5+)** – Explore science, art, and stories. Especially designed for school-age children to imagine, create, discover, and experiment!
- **Lullaby Storytime (30 minute program for families)** – Get ready for bed with stories, music, and activities incorporating early literacy skills. This storytime is geared toward ages 0-5, but the whole family is welcome. Attending in pajamas is encouraged!
- **Saturday Family Storytime (30 minute program for families)** – Practicing early literacy and pre-reading skills is fun with stories, songs, and fingerplays! This storytime is geared toward ages 0-5, but the whole family is welcome. This month we will read books celebrating Women’s History Month.
- **Celebrate Women’s History Month (90 minute program for families)** – Kids and families can participate in crafts, games and activities centered on celebrating the accomplishments of historic American women.
- **Teen Book Talk (1 hour program for ages 13+)** – See the Teens Events Flyer for more information.
- **The Science Behind a Solar Eclipse (1 hour programs for ages 8+)** – On April 8th, a total solar eclipse will occur across parts of the United States, Mexico, and Canada. Most of the US will be able see a partial eclipse. Join Derek Demeter, astronomer and director of the Emil Buehler Planetarium at Seminole State College as we explore the science behind what makes eclipses happen and what to expect on the day of the eclipse.
