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Program Descriptions

Mother Goose on the Loose (20-minute program for children birth to 18 months with adult) — Join us for the nationally recognized Mother Goose on the Loose early literacy program. Enjoy interacting with your little one as you hear stories, learn nursery rhymes and finger plays, sing, move with scarves, and shake bells.

Toddler Time (20-minute program for children 18 months to age 3 with adult) – Stories, songs, puppets and finger plays just for toddlers, while introducing early literacy concepts for parents and caregivers.

Little Learning Stations (1 hour drop in program for children 2-4 with adult) – Drop in with your little one to our Little Learning Stations, which focus on early literacy skills such as: Talking, Singing, Reading, Writing, and Playing. This relaxed and exploratory environment promotes these necessary skills your child will need when learning to read.

Preschool Storytime (30-minute program for children 3-5 years old with adult) – Join in the fun with stories, songs, puppets and more that encourage development of early literacy skills.

Library Explorers (45-minute program for ages 5+) – Explore science, art and stories. Especially designed for school – age children to imagine, create, discover, and experiment!

READing Paws (15-minute time slots for children reading independently) — Children can sign up to practice reading aloud to a therapy dog. READing Paws helps young readers gain confidence and practice fluency! Registration required; space is limited.

Lego Club (1 hour program for ages 5-12) - Calling all Lego builders! Build your own Lego creation, or collaborate with new friends. Legos provided.

We ◆ Art (45 minute program for ages 5-12) - Learn about each artist's unique style. Then create your own awesome art inspired by their creative techniques!

Teen Book Bags (1 hour program for middle and high school students) - Celebrate Black History Month at the Library by designing your own canvas bag based on the artistic style of African-American Expressionist painter and art educator Alma Thomas. All materials will be provided.

Valentine Making for All Ages (2 hour drop-in program for all ages) - Use a variety of special materials to make cards to share with friends and loved ones. Experiment with different styles of card-making! Try using doilies, buttons, ribbon, scrapbook- scissors, and many different kinds of paper.

Family Movie Night (2 hour program for families) - Bring the family to Family Movie Night and come enjoy a movie on us! Bring your own snacks. This month's selection is "**Spider-Man: Into the Spider-Verse**"

Telescope Nights (1 ½ hour program for families) - View the wonders of the night sky! Multiple telescopes will be set up to showcase the celestial sights. In the event of bad weather, a family-friendly indoor program will be held.
