- Mr. Durr distributed same documents that were provided the Technical Advisory Committee at the last meeting. The master plan binder will be the guide for the next three meetings. He proceeded to review the Trails portion. The Committee

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needs to assist in determining what needs attention that does not already have a funding source.

- Mr. Brandenburg reviewed a map of potential future trails to help determine what to put in the referendum and what to leave out. He also reviewed a previously developed scoring system to assist in prioritizing projects.
- Mr. Wilson recommended that the trails should be a minimum of 14' wide and should connect to community and transportation centers.
- In preparing for the next PPAC meeting, Mr. Durr requested Committee members think about what new property needs to be acquired and where we will be in the next 20 – 30 years.

OTHER BUSINESS:

- Mr. Wilson reviewed a new article about Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act. Mr. Brandenburg asked that the article be distributed to the Committee for review prior to the next meeting for discussion at that time.
- Ms. Hanna reported on a Fast Foot Forward Program and she was requested to provide information for distribution.
