

**EXECUTIVE ORDER WAIVING TIPPING FEES AT THE SEMINOLE COUNTY LANDFILL  
(Construction and Demolition Debris)**

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Chapter 252, Florida Statutes, constitutional home rule powers, Chapter 72, Seminole County Code, the Seminole County Board of County Commissioners has adopted the Seminole County revised Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan; and

**WHEREAS**, on September 23, 2022, Executive Order 2022-001 was executed, declaring a Local State of Emergency under the provisions of Chapter 72, Seminole County Code, due to the severe weather; very high winds; heavy rain; threat of tornadoes and serious flooding posed by Hurricane Ian; and

**WHEREAS**, on September 29, 2022 and every seven (7) days thereafter, the Local State of Emergency was extended for an additional seven (7) days as reflected in Executive Orders 2022-005, 2022-008, 2022-010, 2022-011, 2022-13, 2022-014, and 2022-016 due to the severe flooding and remediation of hazardous debris caused by Hurricane Ian and Hurricane Nicole; and

**WHEREAS**, the Governor of the State of Florida has issued Executive Order No. 2022-219 declaring a State of Emergency in all Florida Counties due to Hurricane Ian, and Executive Order No. 2022-253 declaring a State of Emergency in many Florida Counties, including Seminole, due to Hurricane Nicole; and

**WHEREAS**, the remediation efforts from both Hurricane Ian and Hurricane Nicole, such as debris removal, flood remediation, and repairs to utilities and other infrastructure, continue to pose a serious threat to the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of Seminole County; and

**WHEREAS**, there are still extensive remediation efforts taking place throughout the County, including but not limited to debris removal, structural repairs, and repairs to utilities and other infrastructure; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 72.6(b)(1)(J), Seminole County Code, grants the Chief Administrator of Emergency Management the authority to prohibit by Executive Order impose any restriction reasonably necessary for the protection of the health, safety, and welfare of the County's residents; and

**WHEREAS**, the County has decided to waive any tipping fees for dropping off construction and demolition debris at the County Landfill for County residents.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BY THE AUTHORITY VESTED IN ME, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:**

**Section 1. Waive Landfill Tipping Fees.** To reduce the threat to public health due to mold and mildew from construction and demolition debris removed from flooded homes within Seminole County, the County will waive all tipping fees for residential drop off of construction & demolition debris at the County Landfill until close of business Sunday, November 20, 2022.

**Section 2. Alterations or Rescission.** This Order may be altered or rescinded either by the issuance of a subsequent Executive Order or by an appropriate Resolution of the Board of County Commissioners.
