## **2024: A YEAR OF TRAILS, TRAINING, AND TROPHIES!**

Celebrating the milestones and awards of the Seminole County Parks and Recreation Department.













#### **Reaccreditation Achievement**

The Seminole County Parks and Recreation Department achieved reaccreditation from the National Recreation and Park Association's Commission for Accreditation of Park and Recreation Agencies (CAPRA). Meeting all 154 Standards of Excellence, this marks the department's third reaccreditation since its initial recognition in 2009, affirming its commitment to providing the highest level of parks and recreation services.

#### Award-Winning UF/IFAS Extension Team

The UF/IFAS Extension Seminole County team earned 11 national awards from the American Society for Horticultural Science (ASHS), recognizing their outstanding work in webinars, publications, training videos, and more. Their educational materials focused on sustainable landscaping, invasive species, and horticulture. Congratulations to Kaydie McCormick, Morgan Pinkerton, Tina McIntyre, and Bennett Lloyd. McCormick and Pinkerton also presented talks at the 2024 ASHS Conference, showcasing Seminole County's expertise on a national stage.

#### **Sports Tourism Excellence**

The Parks and Recreation Department received the 2024 Excellence in Sports Tourism Award for its support of sports tourism in Seminole County. The Department hosted 92 events last year, generating more than \$63 million in economic impact. This recognition from the Florida Recreation and Park Association highlights Seminole County's state-of-the-art facilities and commitment to driving economic development through tourism.

#### Teen Programming Award

The Seminole County Library celebrated Youth Services Senior Librarian Sara White for winning the Betty Davis Miller Youth Services Award. The Florida Library Association recognized her innovative Teen Cosplay Workshop series, which encouraged teens to create their own costumes and participate in a celebration of creativity. The workshops brought record participation, sparking renewed interest in the Library's graphic novel and manga collections.

#### **Fertilizer Education Spotlight**

Florida-Friendly Landscaping Agent Tina McIntyre and Fertilizer Educator Tom Sacher earned national recognition for their educational video, which won a Bronze Award from the Association of Natural Resource Extension Professionals. The video, created in partnership with the Office of Communications, helps educate both consumers and retailers on fertilizer use. McIntyre also won a second Bronze Award for her radio feature celebrating 30 years of Florida-Friendly Landscaping.

#### Florida Trail Town

In partnership with the City of Sanford, Seminole County celebrated the city's designation as a Florida Trail Town, recognizing its commitment to connecting the Sanford RiverWalk with regional trail systems. This achievement is part of the County's Trails Master Plan, designed to expand and enhance trail networks across the region. Commissioner Andria Herr joined city officials in November to unveil the new Trail Town sign, which will soon be installed along the RiverWalk.

#### Blood Pressure Test Kits 🛇 🕸

UF/IFAS Extension Seminole County and the American Heart Association are providing free take-home blood pressure test kits. Stop by and borrow a kit to test your blood pressure and stay healthy.

High blood pressure (hypertension) occurs when the pressure in your blood vessels is too high, at a level of 140/90 mmHg or higher. It is common but can be serious if not treated.

#### **Battle at Camp Monroe**

Join the Museum for an outdoor commemoration of the battle which initiated settlement on Lake Monroe on Friday, February 7 and Saturday, February 8 at the Sanford Museum.

On Friday, February 7, students are invited to reserve a timeslot and rotate around encampment, examining different aspects of Florida's wartime frontier with experienced experts. On Saturday, February 8, the event will be open to the general public with opportunities for visitors to tour the campus of U.S. Soldiers and Seminoles, talk to living historians, and learn why the battle over Floridian rivers, swamps, and savannahs is one of the longest and most costly wars in U.S. history. Visitors can also enjoy black powder musket and rifle firing demonstrations throughout the event.

At the height of U.S. trading interests and the Belgian Crown, Henry Sanford and other Central Florida elites of the late 19th century invested heavily in colonialist endeavors in Central Africa. Explore how and why Central Florida figured prominently in the Scramble for Africa and the Berlin Conference of 1885, and witness the consequential aftermath as rubber, ivory, and blood flowed out of Central Africa from Zanzibar through the Congo Free State.
