Seminole County is developing its 2045 Transportation Mobility Plan to serve as a guide for future Seminole County transportation improvements and investment decisions through 2045.

KEY PLAN CONSIDERATIONS

The 2045 Transportation Mobility Plan will consider:

- Prioritized roadway infrastructure improvements to enhance safety and connectivity countywide
- Bicycle, pedestrian and accessibility improvements
- Connected walking, cycling, transit and trail networks
- Programs such as Safe Routes to Schools and cycling education to encourage safe active transportation
- Easily accessible public transit (in coordination with LYNX)
- Mobility hubs featuring car-share and bike-share services
- Improvements in underserved communities
- Potential benefits of emerging technologies
- Coordination with regional transportation partners

Improve safety for all transportation users, especially pedestrians and bicyclists

Reduce **congestion** on constrained facilities and improve travel-time reliability
