

ADOPT-A-PARK PROGRAM

The Adopt-A-Park Program encourages community participation in maintaining and enhancing Seminole County parks, trails, trailheads, and natural lands. Organizations, groups, and businesses complete regular maintenance or special projects in their adopted park. Tasks may include:

- Picking up trash
- Weeding and raking playgrounds or landscape areas
- Sweeping shelters
- Cleaning picnic tables
- Mulching trees and shrubs
- Reporting vandalism or graffiti
- Completing special projects such as painting or landscaping

Some tasks are not available year-round and may only be available at specific park locations.

POLICIES:

- Civic groups, sports teams, clubs, businesses, and individuals may apply to adopt a park, trail, trailhead, or natural land in Seminole County. A minimum of a one year commitment is required. If acceptable to both parties, commitments may be renewed for another year.
- 2. Requests to adopt specific parks, natural lands, trails and trailheads are processed on a first-come, first-serve basis.
- Volunteers should monitor their park on at least a bi-monthly basis. Some sites may require additional time commitments.
- 4. Seminole County Leisure Services will provide trash bags and will be responsible for collecting and disposing of the filled trash bags.
- 5. Seminole County may also recognize volunteers on the County's website or social media pages, or in feature articles.
- 6. An adopting organization/group may keep any and all proceeds from any materials with recyclable value that is found and identified as trash.
