HORTICULTURAL TALKS

Master Gardeners are great at sharing their knowledge with both adults and children. If you want to know more about pollinators, growing things, or the environment our volunteers are happy to provide their expertise.

Talks will often include a Powerpoint presentation and, if the topic is pertinent, can also include a hands on portion for students, such as seed starting. A simple pre- and post-test is required for all garden talks to be handed out before the talk, and after the talk has been completed.



EDUCATIONAL GARDENS TRAINING FOR TEACHERS AND VOLUNTEERS.

Want to start a garden, and not sure what is involved? Master Gardeners can be called upon to teach others on how to start and maintain a variety of gardens. Whether it is providing a management plan for a vegetable garden, or which plants to select and maintain in a pollinator landscape, Master Gardeners are happy to help!

PEST AND DISEASE IDENTIFICATION:

GRANT PROGRAM

The Seminole County Master Gardeners offer a yearly Grant program to schools in Seminole County. The grants fund materials necessary to establish a new garden or support an existing garden. Examples include plants, garden soil and mulch, irrigation, MG/ educational signage and, in some cases, tools.

Funding is based on the amount of funds available and the needs of the individual gardens. The suggested award is \$250. Requests for grant funding may be partially funded, and award amounts are subject to change from year to year.

The submission deadline for the Educational Garden Grant is November 1st, and award notifications are sent out by the third week of December.
