Future homeowners are required to attend first time homebuyer and maintaining a home classes prior to participating in the Purchase Assistance strategy. They are also educated on the SHIP program requirements and working with an approved lender. Homeowners who are being assisted with Minor Home Repair funds, receiving rehabilitation to their home or receiving a newly reconstructed home work with staff to learn about the SHIP program and sign an agreement with the program requirements documented. SHIP funds are used for supportive services to low-income households that meet the program guidelines for subsidized rental through the rapid rehousing program, and for security deposit and utility assistance.

#### Provide a description of efforts to reduce homelessness:

On May 24, 2022, LHAP Resolution 202-R-70 was approved and adopted for the approval of the FY2022 - 2024 LHAP. It included a Strategy that allowed County staff to administer SHIP funds for homeless prevention rental assistance strategy, security/utility deposit assistance plus first month contract rent, and rapid re-housing. These activities are on-going to assist in reducing homelessness or households at risk of homelessness. SHIP funds are also leveraged with federal funds from HUD to provide required match for the Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funds.
