- III. City Transportation Project List
 - a. Alex confirmed that Bobby Wyatt has reviewed the list.
- IV. City 10-Year Mobility Plan
 - a. The City noted that they are planning a 2045 mobility plan. They will have projects that would be outside the next 10 years.
 - b. The City note that Jonathan Paul is leading that 2045 mobility fee and plan.
 - c. Bryan Cobb noted that the 2045 is looking at establishing a funding base to implement long-term projects.
 - *i.* The developers would pay one fee that would cover cost of implementing these projects.
 - d. Jacobs noted that the project list was developed using the MetroPlan Orlando's 2045 Cost Feasible Plan.
 - e. Jacobs asked if there are any other projects or developments that may impact this study.
 - *i.* The City noted that their near-term projects are reflected in 10-Year Mobility plan
 - ii. The City asked if the County's plan covers multimodal improvements.
 - iii. The City confirmed that they just approved the 2045 comprehensive plan. This includes addressing the new and old downtown, and the transition in between those areas.
 - *iv.* Jacobs asked if there are any specific projects that the city has already identified.
 - v. The City has a work session scheduled with the City Council in October to discuss future projects.
 - vi. The City stated that the City would be ready to share these long-term projects with the County in a couple months or by the end of the year, once adopted.
 - f. Jacobs confirmed that the purpose of this meeting is to maintain consistency with the Cities and make sure that this study ties into what is happening throughout the County.
 - *i.* Tara noted that Jean joined the call.
- V. City Initiatives & Priorities Discussion
 - a. The City noted that SR 426 and CR 419 widening is a priority.
 - b. The City noted that the widening between SR 50 and I-4
 - c. The City stated that SR 434 was taken off the widening program and instead placed into the complete streets program to address the operational improvements.
 - d. City Manager, Bryan Cobb stated the following projects and considerations in the City:
 - *i.* Should look to connect to SR 426 and CR 419 phase 1 projects and the southern end of phase 1 to Mitchell hammock
 - 1. The Oviedo planning study called for a 3-lane cross section and the City is looking to get that going with a complete street program.

- *ii.* Extending Oviedo Boulevard to Alafaya Woods Boulevard and configuring Alexandria Boulevard to tie into to it.
- *iii.* Slavia Road to connect to SR 434 because it needs to connect the major intersections.
 - 1. Might require a shift of Alafaya Woods Blvd. or Dr. Edward Stoner Way
 - 2. City is still looking to see what to do at Alafaya Woods Blvd. and Mitchell Hammock Rd.
 - 3. The City is looking to get Mitchell Hammock Road connected to CR 419. Might need to be a flyover the river.
 - 4. The intersection at Lockwood Blvd. and Mitchell Hammock Rd. is a problem because everyone is taking the left.
 - 5. Two intersections are the key to the City, which include the intersection of Mitchell Hammock Rd and Red Bug Lake Rd, and the intersection of Lockwood Blvd. and CR 419.
 - Anything the county is doing around those intersections will affect Oviedo
 - One accident at those intersection causes congestions throughout the City.
 - 6. The goal of the City is to increase density to allow for alternative travel options.
 - 7. Massive redevelopments and anything passing east and west through the City affects mobility in the city.
 - 8. Looking at how the signals work together because Oviedo is a peak hour city.
- *iv.* The City asked in there has been any discussion of McCulloch to cross the river.
 - 1. Bill noted that a crossing over the Econ River would be unlikely based on the Commissioners' goals.
 - 2. Teresa asked if there would be different way to access SR 417.
- v. The City noted that a study done in 1996 showed that a connection on McCulloch could reduce traffic by 50% for the City.
- e. Bill noted that they want to identify projects that benefit both the City and the County and avoid conflicts.
- f. The City noted that the renewal of the sales tax is great opportunity to align with other areas.
- g. The County noted that this plan will focus on all modes and not just roadway improvements.
- h. Bill asked if the City is looking at a circulator.
- i. The City stated that they are, but they are still figuring out what that looks like.
 - *i.* This is to connect those economic centers.
 - *ii.* The City stated that they would love to see the flex service expanded.
 - iii. The Riverside Park is expected to be converted to a City Center. The flex service is a great alternative to the bus.

- *iv.* The City is not confident that they would use an autonomous vehicle because it causes congestion due to low speed but a circulator of some kind.
- v. The city noted that the elderly population is fastest growing population.
- *j.* The City noted that they are trying to improve micromobility and how to regulate items like scooters.
- *k.* The City also noted that there is software available to connect people to share trips, thereby reducing congestion.
 - i. These are the things they would like to investigate to avoid the traditional vehicle reliance. The land development code is a great way to help with that.
- VI. Jacobs noted that if there is anything they would to share to please contact Tom Ross.
 - a. The City noted that if there is anything the study team's needs, please feel free to reach out.
 - i. As the City gets further along, they would be happy to share improvements as they are identified for the 2045 fee and plan. The long-term plan is more about visioning.
 - b. The City noted that the 10-Year Mobility Plan is not yet scheduled for adoption, but it should be scheduled within the next couple months.
 - i. The 2045 plan and fee would likely be adopted next year.
 - ii. A working session with the City Council is scheduled in October.
 - *iii.* The City would then negotiate with the County to identify funding distribution and ordinances.

- b. The first project which includes a park is expected to be completed by the end of this year.
- c. Brett stated that they have not seen any large developments that would trigger changes to the master stormwater facility.
 - *i.* The new road is completed there and is to serve as a parallel reliever which may spur some more growth in that area.
 - *ii.* Cathleen noted that their specific street designations that require specific development codes and criteria.
 - iii. Cathleen noted that the City's vision plan has been adopted by the County.
- V. City Initiatives & Priorities Discussion
 - a. Brett stated that they have 20 year mobility fee and plan that includes list and maps.
 - b. Brett stated that the previous LRTP had some project descriptions that wre very general and lacked detail.
 - *i.* Tom stated that this has been a common theme and comment with the County.
 - ii. Brett stated that we should avoid discussing the revised ATC plan.
 - iii. Brett noted that we would like to avoid any projects that are already funded or completed.
 - c. The City stated that the vision zero plan is seeking to reduce speeds along roadways to reduce the severeity of crashes. This also encourages bike/ped and transit activity.
 - d. Alex asked if there have been any specific improvements aimed at increasing bike/ped connectivity to the SunRail stations.
 - i. Brett stated that there is a new trail from the SunRail station to the Seminole Wekiva Trail in Sanlando park. A bid has been received and is pending one final easement with the mall.
 - ii. Brett also stated that the autonomous vehicle project from the SunRail station to Cranes Roost Park has received a grant.
 - *iii.* A second transit system coordinated with the City of Maitland from the Gateway Center to the Maitliand Center is also being proposed.
 - 1. Alex asked if this new connection would be using Autonomous Vehicles.
 - 2. Brett stated that they are looking to get more information on AV for now. An estimate from Atkins has been received.
 - 3. Brett stated that FDOT is going to support the grant for that.
 - iv. Brett stated that Seminole State College and the Advent health is preparing for expansion.
 - v. Brett also noted that they are funding a transit study and is looking at a micro transit and long-term cost to implement. There is potential to have a developers' agreement for expanding transit options.
 - e. Alex asked if the AV would be limited by speed.
 - *i.* Brett stated that novia vehicle reaches up to 18 mph, but their new vehicle would be 25 mph and fully crash certified.

- f. Brett stated that their mobility fee and plan only has one fee. There are some County projects that are included in the mobility plan and would have some funding that comes from the City.
- g. Brett asked the County if the Rhinemore Road project is moving forward.
 - *i.* Bill confirmed that this project is moving forward, but some of the piping materials was delayed.
 - *ii.* Cathleen stated that they also have a project along the segment.
- h. Bill asked what is happening at the golf course
 - i. The City stated that it is a 2 phase project that includes commercial and mixed use. The back end is beign rezoned to allow storage for RVs and boats.
- VI. City Data Request
 - a. Jacobs stated that as part of their existing conditions analysis, they are requesting the latest land use, zoning, and facility inventory GIS data.
 - b. Brett confirmed that Olivia is the GIS data person for the City. A data request form would need to be filled out.
 - *i.* The City confirmed that they have more sidewalk and land use data that may not be included in the Seminole County data.

 - *ii.* Connectivity to the Altamonte Springs SunRail Station via the City of Altamonte Springs and unincorporated Seminole County a priority for bicycle and pedestrian access to the facility.
 - iii. Lemon Lane extension to connect the gap between Reece Way and Lincoln Road will provide connectivity to unincorporated Seminole County and the City of Altamonte Springs via Merritt Street.
 - iv. Connectivity to Amanda Street from the City of Casselberry is a priority to integrate nearby neighborhoods and improve mobility.
- c. The City has deferred to LYNX for any transit needs within the City.
- d. Golf carts are an issue at the micro-mobility level.
- e. Missing links a priority for the City to ensure connectivity between all adjacent areas along with consistent typical sections for the comfort of all users.
- f. The City has the goal of being the most walkable, rollable and rideable City within Central Florida.
- g. The Casselberry Exchange has received proposals for development, although nothing is currently officially moving forward.

 - iii. Celery Avenue capacity improvements.
 - *iv. E.* Lake Mary Boulevard corridor study underway to handle the abundance of development occurring in that area.
 - v. Aero Lane improvements, including at the intersection with St Johns Parkway.
 - vi. 5th Street, from Aero Lane to White Cedar Road will be completely rebuilt starting in Summer 2023.
 - vii. Sidewalk study being conducted near Crooms Academy and sidewalk extension on McCracken Road from the school to Airport Boulevard.
 - viii. Intersection improvements being implemented at Mellonville Avenue at Celery Avenue and increase connectivity to the SCPS Early Learning Center.
 - *ix.* Georgetown Nieghborhood Project, adding curbs, gutters and sidewalks to the existing infrastructure. Phase 1 is scheduled to start soon.
 - x. County is reconstructing Orange Boulevard from SR 46 to US 17-92. Improvements will include bicycle and pedestrian improvements but will not add capacity.
 - b. Multi-family residential developments concentrated on the northwest and southeast sides of the City.
 - c. Significant redevelopment underway at the Seminole Towne Center, however, roadway infrastructure is currently adequate to handle the demand.
 - d. The City asked the County how the one cent sales tax was being handled from a funding perspective. The County shared that they are currently doing their work with the assumption that the funding will be in place to proceed appropriately.

b.	 Alex presented an overview of the plan goals, objectives, and purpose of this meeting. East Urban Area Study Alex stated that the East Urban Area Study is a subset of the overall mobility plan. Project Schedule
	 Alex stated that the project team is currently developing the needs list and is expected to compete the draft report in Summer 2023.

- III. City Transportation Project List
 - a. Alex confirmed that he provided the City with a list of city projects identified from the County and publicly available data.
 - b. Danielle Koury asked why they looked for public facing data instead of grabbing what the County already tracks. The information was pulled from the old website is no longer valid.
 - i. Alex confirmed that they first identified city projects using County data and then added to it using publicly accessible information.
 - ii. Bill stated that this is just a starting point.
 - c. Chris recommended that we use the updated list that is managed by the City's finance department.
 - i. Chris confirmed that the Rinehart Rd project was changed from capacity improvements to intersection improvements based on elected officials input. The Stair Step Park project was removed.
 - ii. Danielle stated that they are keeping roadways as full reclamation to ensure that the costs are covered but would be changed to resurfacing once project needs and costs are confirmed.
- IV. City Initiatives & Priorities Discussion
 - a. Alex asked if there the City has identified any projects focused on lighting.
 - i. Danielle stated that they have not identified any lighting projects, but decorative lighting is expected to be implemented in the future.
 - ii. The City is also doing some hurricane hardening and are burying utility lines along Rinehart Rd.
 - b. Alex asked if there are any sidewalk connections or trail projects within the City.
 - i. The city confirmed that there are no sidewalk or trail projects at this time.
 - c. Alex asked if there are planned developments occurring that may affect this project.
 - i. Chris stated that they have a lot of development on the west side of Rinehart Rd, near the hospitals.
 - d. Danielle stated that they are looking at some segments for complete streets in Downtown Lake Mary. Specifically, N Country Club Rd.
 - e. Chris stated that triple right from EB CR 46A onto SB Rinehart Rd, extension of the NB left turn lanes on Rinehart Rd, double right from SB Rinhart Rd to WB CR 46A and third through lane on Rinehart Rd from CR 46A to Timacuan Blvd are being implemented as part of the I-4 Beyond the Ultimate project.
 - f. Alex asked if there is anything else that the City would like to discuss.
 - i. Chris stated that they are adding an ramp from I-4 to Lake Emma Rd as part of I-4 Beyond the Ultimate.
 - g. Bill stated if the City has any comments and wish lists to please provide to the County at any time.
- V. Bicycle Data Request
 - h. Michael stated that the City had most of the GIS data this team is seeking available online but asked if the City has a bicycle lane shapefile.

i. Krystal Clem stated that they have trail shapefile and will check if they have bicycle lane shapefile
